without incident. The suspect was booked into the Santa Clara County Main Jail.

As a precaution, Campbell Police Department detectives interviewed approximately 35 students at Old Orchard School who had prior contact with the suspect to ensure that there were no unreported incidents of lewd or inappropriate conduct. Old Orchard School administration has cooperated with the investigation and no prior incidents were uncovered. The suspect has been employed by the school for approximately one year. The investigation into his previous employment is underway to ensure that there are no victims elsewhere.

"This case shows why ICAC is so valuable to our community," said Acting Police Chief Larry Esquivel. "Their job is finding and arresting child predators and, thankfully, they're really good at what they do."

SJPD asking for public's help in identifying carjacking suspect



San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is asking for the public's help in identifying and locating a suspect involved in a recent carjacking. On 5/17/2013, at approximately 4:30 AM, the San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received

a report of a carjacking at the Denny's restaurant located at 1015 Blossom Hill Road. Upon arrival, officers located the victim who was suffering from multiple cuts and abrasions. The victim was transported to a local hospital where she was treated for serious but non-life threatening injuries.

Preliminary investigation into the incident has revealed that the victim had just arrived at the parking lot of the Denny's restaurant where she planned to eat. The unknown male suspect then forced open the driver door and entered the victim's vehicle, forcing her over to the passenger seat. The suspect then drove off with the victim still in the car. As the suspect drove northbound on Sanchez Drive at approximately 40 miles per hour, the victim, in fear for her life, opened her passenger door and bravely jumped out of the vehicle sustaining multiple injuries. Officers later found the victim's vehicle a short distance away with the engine still running. The suspect remains at-large. The San Jose Police Department's Robbery Unit is investigating the case.

"Thankfully the victim was not injured worse after jumping out of the car," said Acting Police Chief Larry Esquivel. "Someone in the community will recognize the suspect's photo. We're hoping they'll do the right thing and call the police before he hurts someone else."

***** UPDATE *****

The below press release remains unchanged with the following exception: Suspect Carmen Acevedo, the suspect's wife, was arrested by SJPD on May 9th and later booked into jail for accessory. Detectives determined that Suspect Acevedo drove the getaway vehicle for the suspect after the murder. Suspect Acevedo is currently out of custody. Suspect Louie Garza remains at-large.

San Jose: The San Jose Police Department is asking for the public's assistance in locating a suspect involved in the City's 14th Homicide of 2013. On 5/8/2013, at approximately 12:13 PM, the San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received a report of a male shot in the 2900 block of Westboro Drive in East San Jose. Upon arrival, officers located a male that had been shot at least once. The male was pronounced dead at the scene at approximately 12:25 PM. The suspect, later identified as 55 year old Louie Garza, fled the scene in a vehicle and remains at-large.

The motive behind the shooting remains under investigation. However, the suspect and the victim were known to each other. The San Jose Police Department's Homicide Unit considers suspect Louie Garza armed and dangerous. It is believed that suspect Garza may be headed to the Central Valley (Modesto, Manteca or Madera). It is also a possibility the suspect may be attempting to flee the country.

SJPD seeking public's help in unreported peeping cases



San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is asking for the public's help in identifying possible unreported incidents of peeping and burglary as well as additional information regarding a suspect recently arrested for burglary.

The series of events began on 5/17/2009, at approximately 4:10 A.M. inside a residence in the 1900 block of Story Road. A 13 year old female juvenile sleeping in her bed awoke to find an unknown male standing over her. The suspect became startled when the female woke up and he fled out a bedroom window. Officers responded to the scene and lifted latent fingerprints at the scene identifying the suspect. He was subsequently arrested and charged with trespassing.

On 4/13/2013, between 1:00 A.M and 6:00 A.M., in the 800 block of Mistflower Drive, an unknown suspect broke into a residence occupied by two adult males and one adult female. The suspect stole multiple items while the occupants slept, including an orange that was placed on a Buddhist shrine. Later, the female occupant told officers that the previous day she was in her garage washing her hands when she noticed something over her shoulder. She turned and saw an unknown male standing near a door to the residence masturbating. The male fled the scene on foot.

On 5/2/2013, between 1:30 A.M., and 4:15 A.M., in the 1200 block of Panoche Avenue, an unknown suspect broke into a residence occupied by 9 people including 3 females. The suspect stole multiple items while the occupants slept including a porcelain Buddha statue. One of the female occupants later found that a dirty set of women's underwear had been removed from a laundry basket in the garage and thrown on the roof of the residence. Responding officers lifted latent fingerprints and delivered them to the Department's Central Identification Unit (CIU) for analysis.

The CIU was able to identify the suspect, 38 year old San Jose Resident Pedro Aparicio Guzman, within 5 hours. Officers determined that the suspect was on probation and conducted a subsequent probation search at his residence in the 1100 block of Pipe Dream Court in San Jose at approximately 8:30 A.M. Evidence of both the Mistflower Drive and Panoche Avenue burglaries was located inside the suspect's residence. Officers arrested and booked the suspect for both burglaries. The Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office has charged the suspect with two counts of burglary.

The suspect is a "third striker." Detectives are asking the public for any information regarding both reported and un-reported burglaries where the items taken or the suspect's method of operation resembles those above to determine if he is responsible for additional crimes.

"This was a great job by both our patrol officers and our Central ID Unit," said Acting Chief Larry Esquivel. "These were very bold crimes and they serve as a reminder to lock your doors and windows at night and most importantly, report suspicious activity to the police."

SJPD Arrest Suspects Involved In an Elaborate Fraud/Identity Theft Scheme

San Jose:

Last year, an 85 year old resident of San Jose lost approximately \$100,000 when a personal checkbook was stolen from his home in a burglary. Once the suspects' took possession of the victim's checkbook, they began an elaborate fraud scheme using other victims' identities to drain the 85 year old man's bank accounts.

On May 1, 2013, the San Jose Police Department's Financial Crimes Unit Detective Brian Pettis' investigation resulted in the arrest of three suspects after the MERGE team served a search warrant on their residence. As the MERGE team made entry into the house, they caught two of the suspects in the act of committing identity theft on line. The ensuing search uncovered weapons, narcotics, and evidence of a sophisticated identity theft operation that included equipment and supplies to make fraudulent credit cards, driver's licenses, counterfeit money, and fraudulent checks as a means of stealing the life savings of hundreds of victims and defrauding financial institutions. The additional victims' information appeared to have been acquired through burglaries, mail theft and other means. United States Secret Service agents from the San Jose Office assisting on the search stated that it was the most extensive and inclusive operation they had seen for identity theft in the San Jose area.

The three suspects, 35 year old Toan Nguyen, 33 year old Mai Huang and 27 year old Kent Do were booked into the Santa Clara County Jail without incident. All three suspects had bail set at \$5 million dollars. The investigation continues as the police department attempts to contact additional victims and locate two persons of interest, 39 year old Thach Duong and 44 year old Tri Nguyen.

Deputy Chief Phan Ngo said, "Detective Brian Pettis and the MERGE Unit are to be commended for their outstanding police work. Detective Pettis' investigation not only solved a burglary, where an 85-year-old was victimized, but it also potentially prevented other burglaries and hundreds of identity thefts. I am so proud of not only their exceptional work - but also of their commitment to service to our residents."

Cinco de Mayo Weekend (Vietnamese Version)



Trong quá trình lịch sử, thành phố San Jose đã thu hút được rất đông người tụ tập mừng lễ kỷ niệm Cinco de Mayo, một ngày lễ hội của người Mễ Tây Cơ. Tuy đa số những người đến Trung Tâm thành phố và phía Đông San Jose để kỷ niệm Cinco de Mayo tôn trọng pháp luật, lễ kỷ niệm này cũng đã thu hút một số thành phần tội phạm liên quan tới hành vi bạo động và phá hoại trong những năm qua.

Mục tiêu của Sở Cảnh Sát San Jose là tạo điều kiện an toàn trong cuối tuần Cinco de Mayo. Sở Cảnh Sát đang bố trí thêm nhân viên để đảm bảo có đủ lực lượng để giải quyết thỏa đáng những vấn đề an toàn công cộng có thể xảy ra. Các nhân viên tăng cường bao gồm cảnh sát tuần tra, đơn vị METRO, đơn vị MERGE, đơn vị Garage Services Detail, và đơn vị Dịch Vụ Trung Tâm thành phố. Đơn vị Chống Băng Đảng cũng sẽ tiến hành việc khống chế băng đảng với sự trợ lực của nhân viên Quản Chế Quận Hạt Santa Clara và nhân viên Quản Chế của CDCR.

Người dân sống trong khu vực Trung Tâm thành phố, hành lang đường King giữa đường McKee và đường Tully, hoặc đường Story và Jackson nên biết trước là sẽ có sự chậm trễ về giao thông xe cộ và người bộ hành và được khuyến khích sử dụng các tuyến giao thông khác. Ngoài ra, sẽ có thay đổi đường hướng lưu thông ngoài ý muốn trong các khu vực khác nơi mà tắc nghẽn giao thông nguy hiểm có thể xảy ra. Nhân viên công lực có thể thay đổi hướng giao thông để giảm tắc nghẽn dọc theo các con đường lớn. Việc chuyển hướng giao thông không chỉ tạo thuận lợi cho số lượng giao thông mà còn làm giảm việc các rối loạn này có thể leo thang thành bạo động. Việc chuyển đường hướng xe đi xuống trung tâm thành phố bao gồm đường Số Bốn (Fourth Street) đi về hướng Nam Nam và đường Market (Market Street) đi về hướng Bắc. Việc chuyển đường hướng xe cộ khu Foothill sẽ gồm đường King (King Road). Mọi nỗ lực sẽ được thực hiện để cho phép dân cư trú trong hoặc gần khu vực bị ảnh hưởng bởi việc đóng cửa đường đi lại nơi cư trú của họ không bị chậm trễ. Các xe buýt VTA sẽ được phép thông qua các điểm chuyển hướng giao thông.

Chúng tôi có thể sẽ thay đổi hướng giao thông của khách bộ hành để ngăn chặn bạo động và thiệt hại tài sản mà thường là xẩy ra khi các đám đông tụ tập và thiếu lực lượng công lực kiểm soát. Một lần nữa, nhân viên công lực sẽ cố gắng hết sức để đáp ứng cho những người dân sống gần đó được thuận tiện trong việc đi lại về nhà. Có lúc nhân viên công lực không thể ngăn chặn giao thông một cách an toàn để trả lời những câu hỏi của từng xe một trong khi hàng trăm xe đang chạy nghẹt đường. Trách nhiệm chính của nhân viên công lực là để giữ cho khu phố an toàn và làm giảm bớt bể tắc giao thông để xe cấp cứu có thể ra vô tất cả các khu dân cư trong trường hợp khẩn cấp.

Một trung tâm giới nghiêm lưu động sẽ được thiết lập tại Trung Tâm thành phố để xử lý các vị thành niên vi phạm pháp lệnh giới nghiêm của thành phố (lệnh giới nghiêm là từ 10 giờ đêm cho thanh thiếu niên tuổi 15 hoặc nhỏ hơn, và từ 11 giờ 30 phút tối cho 16 và 17 tuổi). Sở Cảnh Sát cũng đã cân nhắc tới việc trận đấu đội Sabercats đêm thứ Bảy (dự đoán số khán giả là 7,500) và trận đấu đội Sharks trong trận chung kết vào đêm Chủ Nhật trong kế hoạch hoạt động của chúng tối.

Cinco de Mayo Weekend (Spanish Version)



Históricamente, la ciudad de San José ha atraído multitudes de gente que se reúnen para celebrar las fiestas del Cinco de Mayo. Mientras la mayoría de la gente que viene al Centro y al Este de San José para celebrar el Cinco de Mayo obedecen la ley, históricamente esta celebración ha atraído algún elemento criminal que ha sido responsable por muchos crimines de violencia y vandalismo en los últimos años.

El objetivo del Departamento de Policía de San José es de facilitar un medio ambiente seguro durante el fin de semana de Cinco de Mayo. El Departamento va a implementar personal adicional para asegurar que hay recursos suficientes para adecuadamente dirigir asuntos de seguridad que surgieran. El personal adicional incluye Oficiales de Patrulla, La Unidad de METRO, La Unidad de Merge, La Garage Services Detail y el Downtown Services Unit. La Unidad de Investigaciones de Pandillas va a conducir represión de pandillas con la ayuda de Oficiales del Departamento del condado de Santa Clara Probation (libertad provisional) y Agentes de CDCR Parole.

Residentes que viven en el área del Centro, el corredor de la King Road entre Mckee Road y la Tully Road o la Story Road y la Jackson Avenue deben anticipar demora de tráfico y se les sugiere que usen rutas alternas. Además, otros desvíos de tráfico pueden ser activados en otras áreas con congestión y peligro. Oficiales tal vez pueden utilizar desvíos para reducir embotellamiento a lo largo de las calles arteriales. Desvíos de tráfico no solamente facilitan la circulación de tráfico pero también reducen la probabilidad de perturbaciones que puedan intensificarse a violencia. Los desvíos de vehículos del Centro de San Jose incluyen, con rumbo al Sur de la calle Cuatro y con rumbo al Norte de la calle Market Street. Desvíos de tráfico en el Este de San José incluyen la King Road. Cada esfuerzo se harán para permitir la gente que viven en las áreas afectadas de calles cerradas la abilidad de salir y regresar a sus casas sin retrazo. Los autobuses de VTA serán permitidos en las calles de desvíos.

Desvíos de gente caminando en la calle son utilizados para prevenir violencia y daños a las propiedades que frecuentemente resulta cuando grupos grandes de gente se reúnen y permanece en un lugar. De nuevo, Oficiales harán todo lo posible para acomodar a los residentes que viven cerca de las áreas afectadas y que simplemente están tratando de regresar a casa. Oficiales quizás no podrán parar el tráfico para contestar preguntas de un solo vehículo cuando cientos de vehículos están congestionando la intersección. La responsabilidad primaria de los oficiales es de proteger las vecindades y de reducir la congestión de tráfico para que los vehículos de emergencia tienen acceso a todas las vecindades en caso de una emergencia.

Un centro móvil tendrá personal en el Centro de San José para procesar jóvenes que están violando el toque de queda (curfew). Es una violación de la ordenanza de la Ciudad de San José. El toque de queda (curfew) es 10:00PM para jóvenes menores de 15 años y 11:30PM para jóvenes de 16 y 17 años. El Departamento ha tomado en cuenta el juego de los Sabercats el sábado por la noche (se estima que haber 7,500 personas en asistencia) y posiblemente el juego de los Sharks (si es necesario) el Domingo por la noche en los planes de operación.

El Departamento de Policía de San José les pide a aquellos que frecuenten el Centro de San José o las áreas de la King Road este fin de semana para celebrar El Cinco de Mayo que lo hagan en forma segura y responsable. Es Nuestra Ciudad "Our City." Hay que respetarla.

SJPD Plans Anead for Cinco de Mayo wee

San Jose:

Historically, the City of San Jose has drawn large crowds of people who gather in celebration of the Cinco de Mayo Mexican holiday. While the majority of people who come Downtown and to East San Jose to celebrate Cinco de Mayo are law abiding, the celebration has also historically attracted a criminal element that has been responsible for many crimes of violence and vandalism over the years.

The San Jose Police Department's objective is to facilitate a safe environment during the Cinco de Mayo weekend. The Department is deploying additional personnel to ensure that there are sufficient resources to adequately address any public safety issues that may arise. The additional personnel include patrol officers, the METRO Unit, the MERGE Unit, the Garage Services Detail, and the Downtown Services Unit. The Gang Investigations Unit will also be conducting gang suppression with the help of Santa Clara County Probation Officers and CDCR Parole Agents.

Residents living in the Downtown area, the King Road corridor between McKee Road and Tully Road or Story Road and Jackson Road should expect vehicular and pedestrian traffic delays and are urged to use alternate routes. In addition, other unplanned traffic diversions may be activated in other areas where dangerous congestion occurs. Officers may utilize traffic diversions to reduce gridlock along major arterial roadways. Traffic diversions not only facilitate the flow of traffic but also reduce the likelihood of disturbances which can escalate into violence. The Downtown vehicle diversions include southbound Fourth Street and Northbound Market Street. Foothill traffic diversions will include King Road. Every effort will be made to allow citizens residing in or near the area affected by potential road closures the ability to leave and return to their residences without unreasonable delay. VTA buses will be allowed through diversion points.

Pedestrian diversions are also utilized to prevent violence and property damage that often results when large groups gather and remain unchecked. Again, officers will make every effort to accommodate residents who live nearby and are simply trying to go home. At times officers may not be able to safely stop traffic to address specific questions from single vehicles when hundreds of vehicles are congesting an intersection. Officer's primary responsibility is to keep the neighborhood safe and reduce gridlock traffic so that emergency vehicles have access to all neighborhoods in an emergency.

A mobile curfew center will be staffed Downtown to process juveniles in violation of the City's curfew ordinance (Curfew is 10




SJPD has arrested a female suspected of poisoning beverages



San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department has arrested a female in connection with a poisoning attempt at a Starbucks Coffee Shop in South San Jose. On 4/29/2013, at approximately 3:45 P.M., the San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received a report of suspicious activity at the Starbucks coffee shop located in the 6000 block of Snell Avenue in South San Jose. The caller, a barista, reported that a female was seen by another customer removing two bottles of orange juice from a bag that she was carrying and placing them in a cooler area with other refrigerated items.

The customer immediately reported this suspicious activity to Starbucks employees. The suspect apparently overheard this

conversation and quickly fled the coffee shop. The same customer then followed the suspect outside where he recorded the license plate of the vehicle she entered. The Starbucks staff immediately removed the two bottles from their shelves and examined them. The contents of the bottles had a strong toxic smell to them. The San Jose Fire Department's Hazardous Incident Team (HIT) responded to the scene and utilized specialized equipment to determine that the bottles in question contained a mixture of orange juice and isopropyl alcohol (rubbing alcohol). According to SJ Fire Department personnel, the bottles contained lethal doses of rubbing alcohol.

Patrol officers conducted follow-up investigation and eventually located the suspect at her residence in the 5800 block of Chambertin Drive in South San Jose. Officers arrested the suspect at approximately 8:30 P.M. The suspect has been booked into the Santa Clara County Jail for poisoning and attempted murder, both felonies.

Though the investigation is on-going, there is currently no indication of any further danger to the public. The suspect in this case is believed to have acted alone and this incident is believed to be an isolated incident. The suspect's motive remains under investigation.

SJPD Investigating a Major Traffic Collision on the 5400 block of Leigh Ave



San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is currently investigating a serious traffic collision. OnWednesday, April 24, 2013at approximately 3:56 P.M., the San Jose Police Department's "911" Communications Center received a call regarding a vehicle that collided into a house on the 5400 block of Leigh Avenue in South San Jose. Officers arrived on scene and located a Silver BMW that was inside of a house at this location.

A 40 year old female and her nine year old daughter were injured when the vehicle went into their house. The mother was suffering from life threatening injuries and her nine year old daughter sustained non-life threatening injuries. The two were transported to a local area hospital and treated for their injuries. In addition, three people who occupied the silver BMW were also injured and transported to a local area hospital and treated for non-life threatening injuries. A second vehicle involved in the collision (red BMW) was occupied by a solo occupant who was medically treated at the scene and released to San Jose Police.

The San Jose Police Department's Traffic Investigation Unit arrived on scene and made the determination that speed was a factor in the collision. Preliminary Investigation by Investigator's determined that the silver BMW and a second vehicle (red BMW) were driving recklessly. The two vehicles collided with each other sending the silver BMW crashing into the house and a red BMW colliding into a pole at S/E corner of Leigh Avenue and Anne Way.

The two juvenile drivers were arrested for reckless driving resulting in a major injury. The two juvenile were later released into the custody of their parents.

Recent examples of innovation within the Police Department include our "Captain's Corner" postings on www.sjpd.org, as well as our new partnership with **Nextdoor** and the offering of the SJPD **CityConnect** application so that residents can easily access Department services and information directly from their smart phone. Patrol Captains use their "Captain's Corners" to keep residents that live in their division up to date on issues in their neighborhoods and also highlight exemplary police work being done in patrol. CityConnect is an iPhone application that allows residents to utilize a virtual carousel of icons that link to various SJPD resources. Additionally, SJPD will distribute "social media" business cards to advertise SJPD's use of Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, the SJPD.ORG website, and podcasts.

CORE COMPETENCIES

Great customer service

The Department will continue to enhance its use of technology, marketing, advertising and social media in order to educate residents and increase awareness. Increased community awareness can have a big impact on property crimes, which are the crimes most susceptible to prevention through the reporting of suspicious activity and the sharing of neighborhood information. Though the use of technology is extremely important in our quest to provide great customer service, it can not replace the value of a positive interaction with a live police officer or crime prevention specialist.

Gang Enforcement

Reducing gang-related crime and protecting our City's youth from the dangers of the high-risk gang lifestyle is a top priority for the Police Department. Though the Police Department's collaboration with the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force continues to be a great success, we are constantly exploring new and innovative strategies to conduct outreach and education regarding the dangers of gangs. These outreach efforts include partnerships with local schools in order to safeguard our City's youth. The Department recently began a podcast entitled *Gangs 101* that features an experienced gang investigator talking to the community about gangs. The podcast is the first in a series that will cover gang recognition, prevention tips and safe alternatives to gangs.

The Department will continue to utilize a high level of focused enforcement to reduce gang crime in our neighborhoods. Since

February 1st, there have been encouraging downward trends in gang-related crime in San Jose including the following:

- This February, violent gang-related incidents fell 41% from the previous month and 26% when compared to February of 2012
- This March, violent gang-related incidents fell 45% from the previous month and 67% when compared to March of 2012
- Since the implementation of RCITI, SJPD has taken over 43 illegally possessed guns off the streets of our City (26 of those guns were seized during gang suppression efforts)
- Violent gang-related incidents between January and March have dropped from 90 in 2012 to 65 in 2013, representing a 28% decline in violent gang crime in the first quarter of 2013

Additionally, we know from experience that gang members are often responsible for many different crimes in our community, including robberies, burglaries, vandalism, auto theft and various other quality of life crimes. By aggressively enforcing gang crime, we will reduce these other crimes as well.

The Department has trained over 160 patrol officers in the recognition and enforcement of criminal street gangs in an on-going effort to increase the level of institutional knowledge of gangs in our Patrol Division.

"We are off to a great start with RCITI and we are committed for the long term," said Acting Chief of Police Larry Esquivel. "Our message to the community is clear: though your Police Department has faced challenges and uncertainty over the past couple of years, we are still very much focused and engaged in reducing crime. It's about improving the quality of life for the people in our City."

San Jose Police Sobriety and Driver's License Checkpoint, Saturday, April 20, 2013



Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

checkpoints are conducted often enough.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies. San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is investigating the City's 13th homicide of 2013. On 4/6/2013, at approximately 11:40 P.M., the San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received a report of a disturbance involving a male and his 17 year old daughter that had turned physical. Upon arrival, patrol officers located the victim who was unresponsive. San Jose Fire Department Personnel performed CPR on the victim and he was transported to Regional Medical Center via ambulance. The victim remained in critical condition at RMC on life support. The victim later died at Regional Medical Center. Hospital personnel notified the San Jose Police Department and the case was transferred to the Homicide Unit for follow up investigation.

Investigation into the incident has revealed that the victim and his 17 year old daughter had a verbal altercation that escalated into a physical fight during which the suspect pushed the victim to the ground. The victim went into cardiac arrest and later died as a result of the altercation. On 4/12/2013, the 17 year old daughter was arrested and booked into Santa Clara County Juvenile Hall for Involuntary Manslaughter. The suspect's name is being withheld due to the fact that she is a minor.

The San Jose Police Department would like to announce the arrest of a suspect in the July 23rd, 2012 double murder of Pedro and Marybel Jimenez. The Mexican Federal Police, with the assistance of the U.S. Marshal Service, located and arrested Suspect Pedro Castellon Medina in the City of Guadalajara, Jalisco Mexico, on April 9th, 2013.

The suspect Medina is going through the extradition process and will eventually be transported back to San Jose where he will be held to answer for the double homicide.

No other information is being released at this time.

San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is asking for the public's help in locating a suspect in the City's most recent homicide case which occurred on July 23rd. San Jose Police Homicide Detectives have identified Pedro Castellon Medina as the suspect responsible for the killings. Detectives believe that the suspect is either en route or has already arrived in Southern California. Possible destinations in Southern California include Los Angeles, San Fernando, or San Diego. The suspect may possibly be attempting to flee to Mexico. The suspect may use aliases to avoid detection. It is believed that the suspect knows he is wanted. If the suspect is spotted, citizens are encouraged to call 9-1-1. Citizens should not attempt to apprehend the suspect as he is considered armed and dangerous.

The incident in question occurred at approximately 4:21 A.M. on July 23rd. The San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 call center received a report of shots being fired in the 300 block of N. 7th Street. Upon arrival, officers located a residence they believed to be involved. Officers entered the residence to conduct a protective sweep and subsequently located the two homicide victims. Both victims had been shot and were pronounced dead at the scene. Three children living in the residence were recovered safely by officers at the scene.

The motive behind the homicides appears to be domestic violence related. This incident marks San Jose's 21st and 22nd homicides of 2012.

San Jose:

On Tuesday, April 9th, 2013 at 9:16 P.M., we received a report of a small outside fire at the on-ramp for south bound highway 85 at Cottle Road. Once the fire was extinguished a burnt human body of an adult male was discovered. Due to the condition of the body, the Santa Clara County Coroner was called and took possession of it. The California Highway Patrol had primary jurisdiction and initially investigated the incident. The initial diagnosis was unknown cause of death, possibly an accident as there was personal possessions and litter about indicating a homeless encampment.

On Wednesday, April 10th, 2013, follow-up investigation revealed that the victim had been stabbed at least once by the above listed suspect, later identified as Steven Burns. In addition, a second suspect, later identified as Christopher James, was identified as an accessory to the crime.

The motive for the killing is unknown, but the initial investigation has revealed that an altercation occurred between the suspect and the victim resulting in the victim being stabbed to death. The victim was eventually set on fire. The two suspects were apprehended after an extensive investigation and booked into the Santa Clara County Jail on Thursday April 11,2013.

The victim's identity is not being released at this time. We are awaiting coroner identification and notification to next of kin.

The San Jose Police Department has arrested a suspect in the August 13th, 2012 murder of Martin Chacon. The Department's Covert Response Unit, with the assistance of the Tehema County District Attorney's Office, the FBI and the Red Bluff Police Department, located and arrested Suspect Josef Ryan Oakes in the City of Red Bluff, California, on April 2nd, 2013. Suspect Oakes was booked into the Santa Clara County Jail. Detectives have also identified two additional Suspects in the case. Suspect Angel Kiko Martinez was already in custody for state charges on an unrelated case. Suspect Alberto Jose Larez was also already in federal custody for an unrelated case. The Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office has filed murder charges on all three suspects. The homicide is believed to be gang-related.

San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is investigating the City's 11th homicide of 2013. On 4/6/2013, at approximately 2:46 A.M., the San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received a report of a person shot in the 2000 block of Senter Road in South San Jose. Upon arrival, patrol officers located the victim, 37 year old San Jose Resident Viet Tran, down in the street suffering from at least one gunshot wound. The victim was pronounced dead at the scene a short time later.

Preliminary investigation into the shooting has revealed that there was a large party inside the "Elite Audio" business located at 2010 Senter Road. Detectives believe the shooting was possibly the result of a disturbance that started inside the party and spilled outside. Arriving officers detained approximately 25 people who were believed to have been inside the party. Officers entered the building to check for additional victims and met with resistance. Several people barricaded themselves in locked rooms while others hid. Eventually, officers were able to clear the building after deploying less-than-lethal projectiles on four non-compliant individuals during the high-risk search.

Detectives identified several Vietnamese criminal street gangs associated to this party. The suspects remain unidentified and atlarge. The motive behind the shooting remains under investigation. The San Jose Police Department's Homicide Unit is investigating the case.

Headquartered in San Francisco, Nextdoor is a social website that enables residents to get to know their neighbors, ask questions, and exchange local advice and recommendations. Nextdoor allows neighborhoods to establish and self-manage their own Nextdoor website unique to their neighborhood. Information shared on Nextdoor is only visible to verified members.

The City of San Jose launched Nextdoor on National Night Out in August of 2012. Since then, 384 San Jose neighborhoods (87% of neighborhoods in the City) have started Nextdoor websites. The City of San Jose also won the 2013 "Award for Excellence in Local Government" Award from the Alliance of Innovation for its utilization of Nextdoor.

SJPD to Hold Zero Tolerance Distracted Driving Enforcement Operations



San Jose Police Department to Hold Zero Tolerance Distracted Driving Enforcement Operations

(San Jose, CA) -- As part of April's *Distracted Driving Awareness Month* campaign, San Jose Police Department will be actively ticketing those texting or operating hand-held cell phones on April 2nd, 5th, 9th, 15th, 16th, 25th and 29th. Drivers who break the law and place themselves and others in danger will be cited with no warnings. The current minimum ticket cost is \$159, with subsequent tickets costing at least \$279. Last April, over 57,000 tickets were written statewide for texting and hand-held cell use. There were nearly 450,000 convictions in 2012. Whether it's a ticket or a crash, as the campaign theme states, "It's Not Worth It!"

Distracted driving is a serious traffic safety concern that puts everyone on the road at risk. In recent years, hundreds have been killed and thousands seriously injured in California as a result of collisions that involved at least one driver who was distracted. Nationally, an estimated 3,331 died in 2011. As a result, law enforcement across the state, including San Jose Police Department are increasingly cracking down on cell phone use and texting. This April will see over 225 local agencies plus the CHP conducting zero tolerance enforcements.

"We all know that talking on our cell phones while driving is distracting, but that doesn't stop some people from continuing to do it," said San Jose Police Chief Larry Esquivel "This effort is intended to educate our community about the dangers of cell phone use while driving. We hope that once people see the statistics and realize the danger involved, they will change their driving habits to help protect themselves, their families, and others on the road."

Drivers who use hand-held devices are four times as likely to get into crashes serious enough to injure themselves. Younger, inexperienced drivers under 20 years old have the highest proportion of distraction-related fatal crashes. In addition, studies show that texting while driving can delay a driver's reaction time just as severely as having a blood alcohol content of a legally drunk driver.

Studies also show that there is no difference in the risks between hands-free and hand-held cell phone conversations, both of which can result in "inattention blindness" which occurs when the brain isn't seeing what is clearly visible because the drivers' focus is on the phone conversation and not on the road. When over one third of your brain's functioning that should be on your driving moves over to cell phone talking, you can become a cell phone "zombie."

To avoid a distracted driving ticket or crash, San Jose Police Department offers drivers the following tips:

The San Jose Police Department is currently investigating an assault with a deadly weapon incident at WalMart located at 777 Story Road. On 3/31/2013, at approximately 11:15 AM, the Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received a report of a vehicle that drove into the WalMart store at the above location. The driver, later identified as Haamid Zaid, immediately exited the vehicle, armed himself a blunt object and began to physically assault customers in the store. One victim suffered a serious, but non-life threatening injury and was transported to a local area hospital where he remains. In addition, three other victims were treated for non-life threatening injuries at the scene and released.

The suspect Zaid was subdued by customers inside the store and held down until police arrived. When officers arrived on scene they took custody of the suspect after a brief struggle and placed him under arrest. The suspect was booked on four counts of assault with a deadly weapon, hit and run, under the influence of drugs and resisting arrest.

By: Officer Albert Morales #3477 Original Press Release, dated 3/12/13, issued by Officer Albert Morales #3477 After receiving information from a number of different citizens by phone and by social media, The San Jose Police Department with assistance from Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) was able to identify the suspects in the Light Rail Photos as Jozette Rios of San Jose and her older brother, Jonathan Rios of San Jose. Jozette Rios was arrested on Thursday March 14, 2013 at approximately 3:00 P.M. by a Santa Clara County Deputy Sheriff. Suspect #1 Jozette was booked into the Santa Clara County Jail for robbery.

Suspect #2 Jonathan Rios has not been located and remains at large. A felony warrant has been issued for his arrest. Suspect #2 Jonathan is described as being 5'-8" tall, approximately 165 pounds and has brown hair and hazel eyes. Based on the investigation and interviews, it is believed that Suspect #2 Jonathan is homeless and most likely in the Downtown San Jose or Alviso areas. If located immediately call local law enforcement and report his whereabouts.

The identification of the two suspects and the arrest of Suspect #1 Jozette Rios were made possible as a result of the surveillance footage provided by VTA.

"Closed circuit surveillance cameras are installed throughout VTA's light rail fleet, station platforms and transit centers. The system records video and can be viewed in near real-time, often making it possible to respond to incidents as they occur," said VTA Chief Operating Officer Mike Hursh who also oversees the safety and security programs at VTA. "We have been very successful in obtaining numerous security grants from both the state and federal governments to fund and continuously upgrade the technology. This top of the line equipment, along with our dedicated County Sheriff's Transit Patrol and private security officer detail, deters crime in and around our system and also proves helpful in investigations like these."

San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is asking for the public's assistance in identifying and locating two suspects involved in a purse snatch robbery. On February 6, 2013 at approximately 6:52 P.M., a purse snatch robbery occurred in the 500 block of Race St. The victim and the two suspects were riding on the Light Rail train and got off at the Race Street Station. San Jose Police Sobriety and Driver's License Checkpoint, Saturday, March 16, 2013



The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies. Burglary Arrest / Registered Sex Offender



The San Jose Police Department has arrested a 29 year old male transient for an early morning break-in that was interrupted by a resident. On 3/5/2013, at approximately 3:17 A.M., the San Jose Police Department's 9-1-1 Communications Center received a report from a female resident in the 0-100 block of Southbrook Drive that she had awoken to find an unknown male inside her bedroom standing over her. The victim screamed at which time the suspect fled the residence on foot.

Two patrol officers were nearby conducting targeted patrols of that neighborhood due to recent burglaries and quality of life-type crimes in the area. Upon hearing the call for service broadcast on the radio, the officers were able to respond and arrive on scene within 90 seconds. The officers conducted a search and found the suspect nearby attempting to act like he was just an on-looker. Due to the fact that the suspect matched the description provided by the victim, officers detained him. The suspect

was found to be wearing an ankle bracelet and in possession of a smartphone which was running a police scanner application that was set to an SJPD Southern Division channel. "This was a great arrest of a very dangerous suspect," said Acting Chief of Police Larry Esquivel. "Our patrol officers did a great job of quickly getting to the scene and finding the suspect. Because of their quick response, he won't be back out there tonight doing the same thing."

Officer-involved shooting



San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is currently investigating the City's first officer-involved shooting of 2013. On Saturday, March 2nd, 2013, at approximately 2:36 P.M., a patrol officer on routine patrol in West San Jose observed a male in a tan Ford Contour acting suspiciously in the area of Union Avenue and Bascom Avenue. As the officer was preparing to stop the suspicious vehicle, the driver took off at a high rate of speed.

The officer chose not to pursue the suspect out of concern for public safety. Instead, the officer circulated the area and located the vehicle a short time later. Upon seeing the marked police vehicle, the suspect drove directly at the officer and rammed the patrol car head-on. The officer then initiated a vehicle pursuit due to the fact that he had just been the victim of an assault with a deadly weapon (the investigation revealed that this was the only assault with a deadly weapon that the suspect committed with his vehicle).

The officer quickly broadcast that he had been assaulted and additional officers subsequently joined in the pursuit. Several times during the pursuit, the initial pursuing officer broadcast that the suspect was brandishing a handgun at him in a threatening manner. As the pursuit continued, the suspect could be seen throwing multiple items out of the vehicle (those items included a purse, as well as other miscellaneous items of property that did not belong to the suspect). The investigation later revealed that the license plates on the suspect vehicle were stolen.

The pursuit eventually made its way onto Southbound Highway 85 from Bascom Avenue. At this time, the initial pursuing officer had to use his patrol vehicle to block the suspect's path and protect drivers on Highway 85 when the suspect attempted to drive the wrong way against traffic. This maneuver caused a collision with the suspect vehicle resulting in significant damage to the officer's vehicle and so he had to drop out of the pursuit. The remaining officers pursued the suspect vehicle to the area of Blossom Avenue and Calero Avenue in South San Jose. The suspect vehicle was severely damaged by this point and had slowed considerably. The officers, believing that the suspect posed an on-going danger to the public, made the decision to use their patrol vehicles to box the suspect in in an attempt to bring the pursuit to a safe end.

The box-in maneuver worked and the suspect's vehicle came to a stop in front of a residence in the 5800 block of Blossom Avenue. The suspect quickly exited his vehicle with his hands placed in his waistband area. Officer Cooley and Officer Jenkins believed the suspect was retreiving the gun that the initial pursuing officer observed during the pursuit and fired at the suspect in self defense. The suspect was struck by the gunfire and was pronounced dead at the scene a short time later. There were no other injuries reported at the scene.

Officers did not locate a gun on the suspect or in his vehicle. The San Jose Police Department is asking members of the public to notify the Department if they find a handgun on or near a roadway between the Bascom / Union area of West San Jose and the Blossom / Calero area of South San Jose.

The San Jose Police Department's Homicide Unit, which investigates all officer-involved shootings in San Jose, responded to the scene. Both officers involved in the shooting have been placed on routine paid administrative leave. This incident marks the San Jose Police Department's first officer-involved shooting of 2013. The San Jose Police Department had 4 officer-involved shootings in2012 (one was fatal). In 2011, the San Jose Police Department had eight 8 officer-involved shootings (four were fatal).

At approximately 9:30 P.M, a Stanislaus County Deputy Sheriff stopped a vehicle associated to suspect Rhodes in the City of Modesto. The suspect Rhodes was placed under arrest without incident.

The suspect Rhodes was booked into the Stanislaus County Jail and is being held on local charges as well as the outstanding warrant out of San Jose PD.

Robbery Unit Commander Tommy Morales gave the following statement, "This was an excellent collaborative effort by all involved agencies to get a dangerous individual off the streets."

San Jose:

San Jose Police Homicide Detectives have arrested a third suspect in the April, 2010 gang related murder of Jose Antonio Vega Calderon. On 2/22/2013 at approximately 1:30 P.M., the San Jose Police Department's Covert Response Unit arrested Suspect Carlos Ruiz Paz as he was en route to an unrelated court appearance. Paz had a no-bail warrant for murder. Paz was booked into jail and remains in custody.

The homicide occurred on April 21st, 2010 at the corner of W. San Carlos street and Willard Avenue in San Jose. The three suspects attacked the victim and during the attack, the victim was stabbed and shot. The victim was transported to Valley Medical Center where he was pronounced dead at 10:30 P.M. The investigation has revealed that the homicide was gang motivated. During their investigation, detectives identified Jose Torres and Alvaro Ochoa as suspects. The San Jose Police Department's MERGE Unit took Jose Torres into custody on 4/22/2010. The MERGE Unit also took Alvaro Ochoa into custody on May 5th, 2010. Both suspects have remained in custody since their arrests.

"Although this case occurred almost three years ago, our detectives stayed on it with persistance," said SJPD Homicde Unit Commander Michael Kihmm. "The victim's family, the community, and I are grateful for Sergeant Paul Kelly's and Detective John Barg's excellent work in getting these suspects off the streets."

Off-Duty Robbery Arrest



An off-duty San Jose Police Sergeant intervened in a recent in-progress strong-armed robbery on a BART train and arrested the suspect. On February 11th, 2013, at approximately 10:25 A.M., Sergeant Fredrick Kotto, an 18 year veteran of the Department,

and his fiancee were riding a Dublin / Livermore BART train bound for San Francisco on their way to get their marriage certificate. During the ride, Sgt. Kotto heard a loud commotion behind him. Sgt. Kotto turned to see several people in a physical altercation and heard someone yell out, "Stop him! He tried to rob me! Stop him please!"

Sgt. Kotto approached and continued to hear on-lookers yelling out, "Hit the alarm" and "Call the police." Sgt. Kotto observed the suspect standing atop a seat with several passengers around her trying to prevent her from fleeing. Sgt. Kotto saw the suspect pushing the other passengers and trying to escape. One passenger tried to deploy a stun-gun type weapon on the suspect, however the suspect was able to defeat the attempt.

Sgt. Kotto became concerned that the suspect might be able to escape unidentified so he blocked the suspect's path. Sgt. Kotto raised his shirt to display his SJPD badge and off-duty weapon and ordered the suspect to the ground. As Sgt. Kotto then grabbed the suspect's left arm, the suspect tried to pull away. Sgt. Kotto then pulled the suspect to the floor of the train and applied a wrist-lock control hold. As Sgt. Kotto tried to calm the suspect, she continued to struggle. Eventually, Sgt. Kotto was able to verbally calm the suspect and she stopped fighting.

Moments later, the train came to the next stop (West Oakland) and uniformed BART police officers boarded the train and took custody of the suspect. Several passengers cheered and applauded the efforts of Sgt. Kotto and the BART officers. The victim approached Sgt. Kotto and said, "I want to thank you. Thank you so much."

Sgt. Kotto then asked the BART officers if he could provide his statement at a later time so he would not miss his marriage certificate appointment. The BART officers were understanding and Sgt. Kotto and his fiancee made it to their appointment with 4 minutes to spare! Sgt. Kotto later phoned BART detectives and provided his account of the incident. Sgt. Kotto is a veteran Special Operations METRO officer and is currently assigned as an Internal Affairs Investigator.

The Alameda County District Attorney's Office has subsequently filed charges against the suspect for one count of robbery. The suspect's probation was revoked as well.

"Fred's actions on that day don't surprise me at all," said Acting Chief Larry Esquivel of the incident. "If I were that robber, the last person I'd want to see is Fred Kotto," the Chief added jokingly.

Robbery / Assault w/ a Deadly Weapon Arrest



San Jose:

San Jose Police Robbery Unit detectives have arrested a suspect in a violent downtown street robbery attempt. On 2/11/2013, at approximately 10:12 P.M., the adult female victim was walking to her home in the area of North Ninth Street and East Santa Clara Street when the suspect attacked her from behind. The suspect struck the victim in the back of the head, knocking her to the ground. Once on the ground the suspect continued his attack, repeatedly punching the victim in the face. At one point, the suspect grabbed the victim's head and bashed it into the concrete sidewalk and pulled the victim's purse away from her. This was a completely unprovoked attack.

While being fiercely beaten, the victim screamed for help. A nearby adult female witness heard the screams and ran to the

victim's aid. The witness attempted to intervene by pulling the suspect off of the victim. The suspect then turned on the witness and punched her several times in the face. A second witness, an adult male, then ran over and was able to pull the victim's purse away from the suspect. The suspect then fled the scene on foot. The male witness returned the purse to the victim. Paramedics treated both victims at the scene for their injuries.

San Jose Police Robbery Unit detectives identified 54 year old San Jose Resident Edward Brown as a suspect. As the investigation continued, detectives developed reasonable cause to arrest the suspect. On 2/13/2012, at approximately 2:30 P.M., detectives located and arrested the suspect at his residence in the 100 block of George Street in San Jose. The suspect was booked into jail for robbery, assault with a deadly weapon, and felony battery. Suspect Edward Brown is a "3 Striker" and already has two felony convictions for violent crimes. A conviction for this case could land him in prison for life.

SJPD Human Trafficking Task Force Search for Victim's and Target Solicitors

San Jose, Calif -- Plagued by a local increase in prostitution and the global epidemic of human trafficking, The San Jose Police Department's Human Trafficking Task Force and Investigators successfully conducted a two-day sting operation that located and identified a juvenile trafficking victim and netted 14 arrests for solicitation and prostitution. According to **The Exploitation of Trafficked Women** (Neman, 2006), "Generating billions of dollars in profit each year, human trafficking is one of the world's fastest growing criminal activities, operating on the same scale as the illegal trade of guns and drugs".

On Wednesday, February 13, 2013, officers conducted a "John Decoy" operation in the Monterey Road corridor. Officers made eight arrests of individuals soliciting an undercover officer for prostitution related charges.

On Friday, February 15, 2013, officers conducted a second prostitution operation in the Monterey Road corridor. The operation, coordinated through the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) Grant, targeted underage prostitutes. During the operation, the officers arrested and cited four adult male "Johns" and two adult female prostitutes. A third female prostitute was found to be a 16-year-old juvenile runaway from the East Bay. She was taken into protective custody. The juvenile was found to have worked as a prostitute since she was 11-years-old.

Acting Chief of Police Larry Esquivel gave praise to all the officers involved and issued a stern warning to those engaged in prostitution and trafficking activities in the City of San Jose, "This type of activity will not be tolerated in our City. We will continue to look at similar enforcement actions and partnerships to address this problem."

Homicide - 1800 Block of Bermuda Way



The San Jose Police Department is currently investigating the City's 6th homicide of 2013. On 2/14/2013, at approximately 4:21 P.M., San Jose Police Officers responded to the 1800 block of Bermuda Way on a report of a person shot. Upon arrival, officers entered a residence and located a 22 year old female and a 29 year old male deceased from gunshot wounds.

The subsequent investigation revealed that the suspect shot the victim to death inside a bedroom and then killed himself. Investigators determined that the suspect and victim had a previous dating relationship for approximately 5 months before a recent break up. The precise events leading up to the shooting are not known, however the incident is believed to have been a crime of domestic violence stemming from the previous romantic relationship and break up.

San Jose Police Sobriety and Driver's License Checkpoint, Friday, February 15, 2013



The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies. Burglary suspects arrested

The San Jose Police Department has arrested two suspects in a January 28th auto burglary that occurred at Valley Fair Shopping Mall in West San Jose. On January 28th, San Jose Police Patrol Officer Christian Mendoza responded to Valley Fair Mall on a report of an auto burglary. The victim, an adult female, stated that her wedding ring was taken during the burglary. The victim was extremely upset due to the fact that she had worn the same wedding ring for 31 years. Officer Mendoza dusted for fingerprints and was able to lift several quality latent prints from the vehicle.

On February 5th, 2013, the victim contacted the Police Department to check on the status of her case. The case, which was initially designated a non-working case due to lack of manpower, was eventually assigned to Detective Mike Nascimento. Detective Nascimento learned that Latent Print Examiner II Eva Chun was able to quickly identify 35 year old Soledad resident Jose Gonzales as a suspect through her print examination.

Detective Nascimento continued his investigation and learned that Gonzales was a suspect in several other auto thefts and auto burglaries in Santa Clara County. Detective Nascimento learned that Suspect Gonzales and a second suspect, Jorge Morales, were scheduled to appear in court in San Jose on February 8th for a pending auto theft case. Both suspects had been arrested on January 25th, 2013, for stealing a vehicle from Oakridge Mall in San Jose. Detective Nascimento showed up at the court hearing and arrested Jorge Gonzales for the Valley Fair auto burglary. Jorge Morales was also arrested for being under the influence of narcotics. Outside the court house, Detective Nascimento conducted a probation search on the suspects' vehicle and located evidence that linked them to the victim's auto burglary at Valley Fair.

During the ensuing investigation, Detective Nascimento learned that Jose Gonzales had traded the ring for narcotics two days prior in the City of Soledad. The suspect assured Detective Nascimento that, if released, he could recover the ring from the drug dealer. Gonzales was subsequently released and at 6:00 P.M. on February 8th, he called Detective Nascimento to inform him that he had recovered the ring and several other items taken during the burglary. The suspect took the items to the Soledad Police Department and gave them to an officer for safe keeping.

On Tuesday, February 12th, the ring was returned to the victim by way of her sister, who lives in San Jose. Detective Nascimento's supervisor spoke with the victim and she asked him to thank everyone involved in "returning a part of her life she thought she would never see again."

Acting Chief of Police Larry Esquivel applauded the teamwork. "This was a perfect combination of good patrol work, good fingerprint analysis, and good detective work. Detective Nascimento did a great job of talking with this suspect and convincing him to track down this woman's property and return it!"

SJPD arrests three suspects in robbery spree

The San Jose Police Department has arrested three suspects in the January 21st home invasion robbery that occurred in the 6700 block of Bret Harte Drive in South San Jose. On January 21st, at approximately 5:30 P.M., the three suspects knocked on the front door of the victims' residence. When the occupants opened the door, the suspects forced their way inside. At least one of the suspects was armed with a knife. Once inside, the suspects bound both victims with duct tape and secluded them into a room of the residence. The suspects then ransacked the residence, taking electronics, credit cards and cash. The suspects demanded keys for both of the victims' vehicles, a green 2007 Toyota Highlander and a tan 1997 Toyota Camry, and then fled the scene in the victims' vehicles.

Within 24 hours, both victim vehicles were recovered. The California Highway Patrol was involved in a high-speed pursuit with the Camry on Highway 152 which exceeded 100 miles per hour. The CHP later located the abandoned Camry near Highway 101 and Highway 152. Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office divers located the Highlander submerged in the Uvas Reservoir after a witness had called in to report suspicious activity. During the ensuing investigation, San Jose Police Robbery Unit detectives identified James Palmerson, Miguel Marez and Ezra Santana as suspects in the home invasion robbery. There is no known link between the suspects and the victims of the home invasion.

On 1/24/2013, at approximately 11:15 A.M., San Jose Police Department patrol officers located and arrested Suspect Palmerson during a call for service. Later that day at approximately 3:00 P.M., the San Jose Police Department's Covert Response Unit (CRU) arrested Suspect Marez in San Jose. CRU then located and arrested Suspect Santana on 1/25/2013 at approximately 4:00 P.M. in the City of Gilroy. Robbery Detectives continued their investigation and determined that all three suspects were responsible for three previous armed robberies in a crime spree that spanned from January 19th, 2013 to January 21st, 2013. All of the robberies occurred in the City of San Jose.

The first robbery occurred on 1/19/2013 at approximately 11:42 P.M. in the 4100 block of Monterey Highway. The suspects approached the victim, brandished a knife and demanded money. One suspect took property from the victim while another suspect stabbed the victim multiple times. The victim was treated at a local hospital for non-life threatening injuries. The suspects fled the scene.

The following night, the second robbery occurred at approximately 12:05 A.M. in the area of Story Road and Knox Avenue. One of the suspects brandished a handgun and a second suspect physically assaulted a food vendor with a blunt object. The suspects stole an undisclosed quantity of cash from the victim and fled the scene. The victim was transported to a local hospital where he was treated for non-life threatening injuries.

The third robbery leading up to the home invasion occurred on 1/20/2013 at approximately 1:37 A.M. in the 2800 block of Story Road. In this case, the suspects entered a business that was closing. The suspects brandished a handgun and a blunt object and demanded money. One of the suspects physically assaulted the victim with the blunt object while the second suspect brandished a handgun at the remaining employees. The suspects fled the scene with an undisclosed quantity of cash. The victim received minor injuries and was treated and released at a local hospital.

All three suspects remain in custody on numerous counts including armed robbery, false imprisonment, assault with a deadly weapon, kidnapping and burglary. Robbery detectives have recovered all of the personal property taken in the home invasion.

"This case exemplifies the talent and professionalism of our officers," said Acting Chief Larry Esquivel of the case. "Our Robbery Unit's hard work not only solved a violent home invasion, but they solved three other violent robberies as well. I'm proud of the hard work of our detectives and patrol personnel. Working together, they took three very violent criminals off the streets of San Jose."

Recent Robbery and Burglary Arrests attributed to Great work by SJPD Officers



San Jose, Calif -- San Jose Police Department would like to recognize exceptional police work done by officers during a recent string of armed robberies and commercial burglaries.

On January 20th, 2013 two suspects, one armed with a gun, physically assaulted the victim and took an item from his possession. The suspects fled the scene in a vehicle. The description of the suspects and the vehicle they were driving matched the description of two additional reported armed robberies. Officer Chris Camarillo located the vehicle driving in the area of Monterey Hwy/ Curtner Avenue with two occupants. The driver and the passenger were stopped and detained. The suspects were also in possession of stolen property from two other reported robberies. Officers also located a loaded firearm and subsequently arrested the two suspects.

On the same day, Officers Chris Drew and Officer Douglas Gates, who were conducting follow up investigation of a series of commercial burglaries, located an involved stolen vehicle and processed it for evidence. After further extensive follow up investigation by the patrol officers, they identified and located four of the involved suspects. The officers linked the suspects to 9 commercial burglaries (two from the City of Campbell). Three suspects were arrested for burglary and possession of stolen property. One suspect was arrested for possession of stolen property.

When he learned of the arrests, Acting Police Chief Larry Esquivel said, "These two investigations highlight the excellence and quality of police work our officers put out on a daily basis. I would like to thank the officers for thier continued hard work."

San Jose Police Sobriety and Driver's License Checkpoint, Saturday, January 19, 2013



The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies. When officer arrived they determined that a fight had indeed taken place and a 14-year-old male victim had been transported to Regional Medical Center in San Jose. The victim remain hospitalized until he died of his injuries on Monday, April 30th, at approximately 2:23 P.M.

Preliminary investigation into the homicide has revealed that the victim was involved in an altercation and received severe injuries requiring hospitalization. The suspects fled the scene prior to police arrival. The homicide is believed to be gang motivated. No suspects have been identified or apprehended in this case.

This incident marks San Jose's 13th homicide of 2012. This was the 5th gang-related homicide of 2012.

UPDATE Homicide - 1600 Block of Oakland Road



San Jose Police confirmed the suspect Nguyen and victim Bangalan attended a party at a business on the 1600 block

of Oakland Road. An argument occurred inside the party which ultimately led to the victim Bangalan being stabbed. The victim was pronounced deceased at the hospital a short later. The suspect fled scene and was located several hours later after homicide detectives received information of his involvement and whereabouts.

San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department is currently investigating the City's 45th homicide of 2012. On 12/21/2012, at approximately 2:59 A.M., San Jose Police Officers responded to the 1600 block of Oakland Road in North San Jose on a report of a male who had been stabbed. Upon arrival, officers located 30 year old Steve Bangalan suffering from at least one stab wound. The victim Bangalan was transported to a local area hospital were he was pronounced deceased at 3:38 A.M.

The preliminary investigation has revealed that their was a private party at business in the area. The victim Bangalan was suffering from at least one stab wound when police arrived. Medical personnel arrived and the victim was immediately transported to the hospital. The motive behind the stabbing remains under investigation, however it is not believed to be gang related.

Homicide detectives are actively investigating this case.

San Jose Police Sobriety and Driver's License Checkpoint, Friday, December 21, 2012



The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies.
