San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department has arrested four suspects and booked them into Santa Clara County Jail on multiple counts of robbery.

Over the last year, the Bay-Area has seen a dramatic increase in Chain-Snatch robberies. The suspects targeted women of all ages, often of South-Asian descent. The victims were conducting everyday activities such as shopping or taking walks when a male would approach and rip gold jewelry from their necks. If the victim resisted, the suspect frequently struck and punched the victim until they could complete the robbery. A firearm was brandished in several of the incidents. After the robbery, the suspect would flee in a waiting vehicle.

These robberies not only caused the victims shock and lingering fear due to the violent attack; but the victims oftentimes lost property of significant cultural, religious, and personal value. The manner in which this jewelry was later disposed of created an inability to ever recover the property and reunite it with the victim.

San Jose Police Robbery Detectives partnered with the Sunnyvale DPS, Santa Clara Police Department, and the Milpitas Police Department who were experiencing robberies with similar methods of operation. Detectives conducted an exhaustive investigation and learned the suspects oftentimes stalked the victim before the attack. With the cooperation of witnesses and examination videos from businesses, Detectives identified the four suspects listed above as taking part.

Detectives are continuing the investigation to identify additional suspects. Several search warrants were executed which garnered evidence of these suspects being responsible for numerous robberies. However; the Robbery Unit knows there are other robberies that have occurred but have gone unreported. We are seeking the public's help in locating victims. In addition, we are looking for the owner of this particular piece of jewelry. We believe it was stolen in East San Jose sometime in late November.



Sergeant Larry Day of the San Jose Police Department Robbery Unit wanted to thank the detectives from Sunnyvale, Santa Clara and Milpitas Police Departments stating Crime knows no boundaries and neither should we. Having a great relationship with these other Departments allows us to investigate these crimes, identify victims, and successfully prosecute the persons responsible even with reduced staffing.

The San Jose Police Department has entered into a partnership and developed a Gun Buy Back program. The San Jose Police Department's Gun Buy Back is designed to reduce the number of unwanted firearms and reduce gun violence within the City of San Jose.

The Gun Buy Back Program provides local residents an opportunity to voluntarily turn in firearms in exchange for gift cards. The 2014 SJPD Gun Buy Back Program will be held on Saturday, December 13, at PAL Stadium located at 680 S. 34th Street, San Jose.

This program is a partnership among San Jose City Council Office District 5, the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office, San Jose Police Department, Office of Santa Clara County District 2, Office if California State Assembly District 27, Office of the 17th Congressional District.

Guns collected will be checked for lost or stolen status, and if applicable, will be returned to their legal owners. All other firearms will be prepared for destruction.

Funding for this important event is raised from public and private donors and tax-deductible donated funds are held by San Jose Police Foundation, a non-profit 501(c)(3) account.

Those who turn in a gun will receive a gift card. \$100 will be given for handguns, rifles and shotguns and \$200 for Assault Weapons.

San Jose:

The San Jose Police Department has arrested Jacob Breschi and booked him into Santa Clara County Jail on multiple counts of residential burglary.

Beginning in early November of 2014 to December 10, 2014, a rash of burglaries occurred in the Foothill and Southern Divisions of San Jose. Through a diligent and thorough investigative process, officers identified Breschi as a possible suspect. Further investigation determined he was responsible for at least thirteen residential burglaries. In two of these burglaries guns were stolen from the home and in at least two incidents the victim confronted the suspect during the crime. Detectives believe Breschi might be responsible for up to seven additional burglaries.

On December 10, 2014, Officer Ryan Chan took Breschi into custody and booked him into County Jail on multiple counts of burglary. Foothill Division Captain Knox said, "This is an excellent example of the strong partnership between the San Jose Police

Department and the community in combating these residential burglaries."

SJPD Unmanned Aerial System Technology The San Jose Police Department (SJPD) is exploring the possibility of using Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) technology, commonly referred to as a drone, in a limited scope.

About the UAS

Earlier in 2014, the Police Department obtained one UAS, specifically for the SJPD Bomb Unit. The UAS is a Century NEO 660 Hex-Rotor which has a Go-Pro camera for aerial video footage. The UAS is 3 feet wide and 1.5 feet tall.

If and when policies and procedures are drafted and finalized, the SJPD would ensure the UAS usage would be compliant with FAA regulations, federal and state law. The SJPD would also obtain a Certificate of Authorization (COA) from the FAA prior to using the UAS.

The SJPD is not using the UAS currently.

The SJPD made a presentation to the Neighborhoods Commission about the UAS on Wednesday, Nov. 13, 2014. The purpose of the discussion was to seek input from the commissioners about whether UAS technology is appropriate for police to utilize in San Jose as well as to ask for the commission's assistance with community outreach.

San Jose, CA -- San Jose Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on Friday, November 21, 2014 at an undisclosed location within the city limit between the hours of 8:00 pm to 2:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 8 lives and resulted in injury crashes harming 462 of our friends and neighbors, said Sgt Steve Payne.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Nearly 90 percent of California drivers approve of DUI checkpoints.

DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses

that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to Report Drunk Driver Call 9-1-1.

San Jose, CA -- San Jose Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on Friday, September 19, 2014 at an undisclosed location within the city limit between the hours of 7:00 pm to 1:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one

third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies. On September 12, 2014, there were eleven (11) burglaries reported in District Paul which is located near the Evergreen Area of East San Jose. In all of the cases, patrol units and/or Community Service Officers (CSO) responded and conducted an investigation.

One of the cases, citizens reported suspicious activity and patrol officers were able to locate and arrest two (2) suspects. Without the citizens' assistance, officers may not have located the suspects.

As staffing and call volume allows, patrol units (especially those assigned to dayshift) try to be visible in the areas where burglaries are occurring. When a burglary is reported, a patrol officer or CSO responds to conduct an investigation. In three (3) of the eleven (11)cases, a CSO was able to obtain latent fingerprints, which may ultimately lead to the identification of a suspect in the crime. The investigation is active and on-going and we will provide additional information as it becomes available.

The most important element of burglary suppression is citizen involvement. Citizens need to be encouraged to look after their neighbors and to report suspicious activity.

Arriving Officers located the unresponsive female victim, later identified as Betty Jennings, face down with multiple visible injuries. Due to the severity of the victims injuries she was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Follow up investigation by San Jose Police Officers led to the identification and arrest of the suspect-18 year old Kevin Enamornado. The victim and suspect are known to be transient and were congregating in the area with several other individuals prior to the homicide. Sometime during the night, the victim was beaten to death by the suspect. Arriving Officers were provided information that the suspect was sleeping in the area and responsible for the assault. Officers arrested the suspect and transported him to the San Jose Police Department for processing before he was booked into the Santa Clara County Jail on the charge of murder. At this time, we believe Enamorando is the primary suspect.

San Jose, CA -- San Jose Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on Friday, September 12, 2014 at an undisclosed location within the city limit between the hours of 7:00 pm to 1:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers will be contacting drivers passing through the checkpoint for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. Officers will also check drivers for proper licensing and will strive to delay motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Drivers caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, and insurance increases, as well as fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000.

In 2010, over 10,000 people were killed nationally in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% or higher. In California, this deadly crime led to 791 deaths because someone failed to designate a sober driver. "Over the course of the past three years in San Jose, DUI collisions have claimed 32 lives and resulted in 1641 injury crashes harming 531 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Steve Payne.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

"DUI Checkpoints have been an essential part of the phenomenal reduction in DUI deaths that we witnessed since 2006 in California," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. "But since the tragedy of DUI accounts for nearly one

third of traffic fatalities, San Jose needs the high visibility enforcement and public awareness that checkpoints provide."

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the San Jose Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies. The Community Service Officer is a new civilian position in the San Jose Police Department. Numerous cities nationwide have utilized Community Service Officers within their Police Departments for many years. In 2010, the City Auditor recommended the Police Department create the position as part of a Civilianization Audit.

The Community Service Officers will be deployed in the field to assist police officers by responding to and investigating lower priority calls for service, so police officers will be available to respond to higher priority emergency calls for service and have more time for proactive enforcement. The Community Service Officers will not perform any enforcement duties, such as issuing traffic or parking citations, towing abandoned vehicles or making arrests. The types of calls the Community Service Officers will respond to and investigate include:

- · Burglary commercial, residential, vehicle
- Petty theft
- Grand theft
- Vehicle theft initial report and/or recovery
- Vandalism
- · Non-injury traffic collisions
- Missing persons
- Road Hazards
- · Directs and controls crowds and traffic at accidents or special events including setting up cone and/or road flare patterns

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What type of training have the CSOs received?

The CSOs have attended a five-week Academy. During the Academy they had instruction covering a variety of topics including Criminal Law and Investigation, Evidence Collection, Report Writing, Accident Investigation, First Aid/CPR, Vehicle Operations, Interviewing persons, Defensive Tactics, Etc.

How many CSOs does the Police Department employ?
 The City Council has approved the Police Department to hire 28 CSOs.



3. How are the CSOs deployed?

The CSOs will be evenly spread throughout the city. There will be seven CSOs assigned to work in each of the four Divisions; Central, Foothill, Southern and Western Divisions.

- 4. What days and hours do the CSOs work? The CSOs will work Monday through Friday. There will be two shifts; the day shift will work from 8 AM to 4:30 PM. The swing shift will work from 12 PM to 8:30 PM.
- What type of uniforms do the CSOs wear? The CSOs wear light blue uniform shirts, a badge that says Community Service Officer, dark blue pants and a Duty Belt with a Radio, Pepper Spray and a flashlight.
- 6. What type of vehicles do the CSOs drive? The CSOs will be driving either a full size pickup truck or a small hatchback vehicle. They will be white in color with Community Service Officer graphics across the sides and back.
